Length: 1000-1500 words.

3 Option a) Write a short story incorporating at least 20 phrases from Shakespeare's plays, poems or sonnets
Option b) Write and illustrate a short graphic novel, creating a new story by drawing together Shakespearean characters from at least two Shakespeare plays
Length 300-500 words (6-12 pages).
